There has been significant growth in donation and transplantation since the Australian Government's national program to increase organ donation for transplantation started in 2009.

Over the past 11 years, the number of organ donors has more than doubled, with almost twice as many people receiving a transplant.



While the number of deceased organ donors in 2019 remained relatively stable compared with 2018 (554), more patients than ever before were identified and considered for organ donation, and more families were approached about the opportunity for their loved one to be an organ donor. However, donation was not possible in all cases.
